Monday, 4th June, 2018

7.00 pm

Within the Assembly Hall

The Right Rev Dr JNI McNeely, Moderator of the General Assembly, welcomed, on behalf of the Assembly, the Vice Lord Lieutenant of Belfast, representatives of sister Churches, and of educational and community organisations, and other special guests present.

The Moderator led in public worship, expressing thanks for the help he had received during his year in office. After delivering an address he constituted the Assembly with prayer.

The Rev Trevor D Gribben, Clerk of Assembly, announced that the names of 571 ministers being ex officio members and 412 commissioned elders, had been entered on the Roll of the Assembly, together with 41 Assembly Elders, Conveners and nominees of the General Assembly Nominations Committee. In addition 334 people in various categories, not members of the court, have been

invited to sit and deliberate, including 18 from other Churches.

Church of Ireland Synod (2018)

The Very Rev Dr Frank Sellar reports:

148th General Synod meeting in Armagh (10th – 12th May 2018)

1. Attending the opening Eucharist on Ascension Day, it was a joy to appreciate the light streaming through the great East Window in Armagh Cathedral bringing to life the depictions of the ascended and reigning Lord. This and the fine sermon by The Rt Rev John McDowell, Bishop of Clogher speaking about the giving of gifts by Jesus to the Church, was like a metaphor for this year's Synod.

2. Mrs Sadie Somerville (elder from 1st Armagh) and I attended on behalf of PCI and while much of the business seems routine; dull even, like looking at a stained glass window from the outside of an ecclesiastical building in, once inside and looking out, with the benefit of the light of Christ shining through, even the routine becomes brighter.

3. Sir Paul Girvan used this analogy when commending a new beautifully produced Commentary on the Constitution of the Church of Ireland: the laws of the church, a product of disestablishment.

4. Key decisions this year included a Bill uniting in principle, the dioceses of Limerick and Killaloe with Tuam, Killlala and Achonry and the introduction of a Bill which seeks to establish a proportional and representative formula for the allocation of seats in the House of Representatives and General Synod reducing its number from a current 648 to 531.

5. Following a debate on same sex marriage last year, this Synod the House of Bishops announced that there is little appetite in the church to redefine marriage and so the marriage service remains unchanged and marriage may be solemnized only between and man and a woman.

6. A new Order of Service for morning and evening prayer has been produced by the Liturgical Advisory Committee and leave was given for a Bill to be approved next year for a liturgy to be used in situations of Miscarriage, Stillbirth and Neonatal deaths.

7. A very warm welcome was given by Synod to Dr Eamon Martin, Roman Catholic Archbishop of Armagh who along with Dr Richard Clarke launched a pilot project designating the two Armagh cathedrals places of safety for people affected by domestic violence, which it was hoped other parishes might take up.

8. A highlight for me was the very stimulating presentation on Third Level Chaplaincy shared by Rev Barry Forde from Belfast and Rev Rob Jones from Dublin. Leading teams in both locations a fine and imaginative work is being done among 'the lost generation' of students.

9. It was a privilege to bring greetings to the Synod from our General Assembly and a delight to renew friendships with past acquaintances and present friends and to sense the light of the presence of the ascended and reigning Lord among His people in the Church of Ireland.

10. General Synod 2019 will take place in Millennium Forum in Derry/Londonderry, from 16th-18th May and 2020 in Croke Park Events Centre from 7th-9th May.

Section 1 of the Report of the **GENERAL COUNCIL** (Reports pp1-4, 15-67) along with resolutions 7-15 (Reports pp143-144) was submitted by the Very Rev Dr RL Craig, together with the following Supplementary Reports:

(A) SUPPORT SERVICES COMMITTEE

Correction to Finance Panel Report

1. Delete the current paragraph 3 on page 16 and substitute with:
 3. The Committee gave consideration to a report from the Panel on the pros and cons of a change in the Church's financial year end from 31st December to 31st August – the latter to coincide with the end of the 'church year'. Given the considerable disruption that would result from a change, the Committee agreed with the Panel's advice that a review should be undertaken into the implications of retaining the existing year end but revising the timetables for the preparation of end year accounts and statistical returns in the light of necessary approval requirements and the filing of accounts with the Charity Commission. However, the Committee endorsed the conclusion of the Panel that a new deadline should be set for the annual statistical return (and in effect for CCNI accounts) of 30th April, with the annual return being split into a statistical part and a financial part. The statistical part would be completed in line with the present arrangements i.e. submitted to Presbytery by February/March and then reported through the current structure to the General Assembly. The financial part would come before a May meeting of Presbytery and then summaries would be presented to a new General Council meeting in June. The Minutes and Statistics Book would include the present summary tables, graphs and individual congregational details. These new arrangements should be implemented for the financial year ended 31st December 2018. Collated information on the statistical returns was not available to the Panel at its 29th March meeting, due to delays in filing reports on the part of some Presbyteries. They were presented directly to the General Council at its meeting on 10th April and summaries are included in Appendices 4 and 5.

Retirements

2. Since the last meeting of the Support Services Committee an application for leave to retire under the provisions of the Par 223(3) of the Code has been received from the Route Presbytery in relation to Rev N McClean (First Kilraughts). Mr McClean is seeking permission to retire on or after his 64th birthday. The terms of retirement will reflect the appropriate pension scheme early retirement factors. An amended resolution 9, standardising the wording relating to another retirement which is included in the Reports, is also appended.

Presbyterian Church in Ireland Pension Scheme (2009)

3. At the time of writing the Trustees of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland Pension Scheme (2009) have just received the initial results of Actuarial Valuation of the Scheme, as at 31st December 2017. There is a statutory requirement for all pension schemes to have such a valuation every three years and the results of the valuation indicates the level of funding that is required for the pension scheme over the next number of years.

4. The Support Services Committee acts as ‘the employer’ for matters relating to the PCI Pension Scheme (2009). Meetings will be held over the next number of months to consider the results of the actuarial valuation and the response that is necessary, especially with regard to funding levels. As appropriate action will be required prior to the meeting of the 2019 General Assembly (the statutory deadline for response is 31st March 2019) it is proposed that the General Council be authorised to take necessary decisions, in particular with regard to funding levels. An appropriate resolution is appended.

5. The Clerk of Assembly has requested that the Pension Trustees and Actuary seek to ensure that the next set of statutory actuarial valuation results (as at 31st December 2020) are available at an earlier date, thereby enabling the General Assembly itself to make any necessary decisions relating to those results in 2021.

(C) Memorial Record

The **Rev William Harold Gray, BA, BD**, Minister Emeritus (Released) Harmony Hill, Lambeg, died on 18th April 2018, in the ninety-second year of his age and the sixty-second year of his ministry. He was born at Belfast on 1st July 1926, the only child of William Gray, a joiner and builder, and his wife Florence, née Hanson. The family worshipped in St Enoch's congregation, Carlisle Circus, where his father was an elder and his mother a stalwart of the Women's Missionary Association (WMA). As a teenager he made a conscious commitment to Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour. He served as Boys' Brigade Captain and as Sunday School Superintendent, both then very large organisations, enabling him to hone his leadership skills. Mr Gray trained as a teacher at Stranmillis College and the Queen's University, graduating BA in 1948. He returned to the Boys' Model where he taught for four years from 1948 to 1952. During this time his sense of a strong calling to the ordained ministry grew, and, on being accepted for training, he attended the Assembly's College, 1952 to 1953, New College, Edinburgh, 1953 to 1954, and returned to Belfast to complete his training 1954 to 1955. From 1954 to 1956 he served as Assistant in Great Victoria Street congregation with the Minister, the Rev J R Boyd, who later became Professor of Practical Theology in the Assembly's College. The Presbytery of Tyrone ordained and installed him in the congregation of Newmills, near Dungannon, on 17th October 1956. A few years later Newmills was joined with Carland and Mr Gray was installed there on 1st June 1960. He married Jean Kelly, who was also brought up in St Enoch's, on 6th July 1955, and together they served Christ and His Church with enthusiasm and dedication over the years. They had three children, Peter, David, and Catherine. After thirteen years of steady ministry Mr Gray moved to the large congregation of Woodvale, Belfast, with eleven hundred families, where he was installed by the Presbytery of North Belfast on 10th September 1969. He and his family arrived there just as the 'Troubles' broke out severely impacting the local area and residents. Soldiers were a common sight on the streets, barricades were thrown up, communities bitterly divided, gun battles and bombs frequent. Homes and businesses were destroyed and church property damaged. The church halls were opened to all comers as a place of shelter and Mr Gray worked tirelessly to help those most affected by the turmoil and to create friendly relationships across the sectarian divide. In 1976 he moved to the congregation of Harmony Hill,

Lambeg, and was installed there by the Presbytery of Dromore on 23rd January 1976. This was a young congregation which began as an outreach ministry of First Lisburn at Lambeg and was erected a congregation in its own right in February 1968 with Rev D.H.A. Watson as Minister. By the nineteen-seventies it was a thriving congregation with a large number of young families who settled in the new builds in the surrounding area. Mr Gray excelled as a pastor who loved his people and ministered to their needs in all the varied circumstances of life. He was assiduous in his pulpit preparation and delivery of the Good News of the Gospel. In the wider community he became a member of Wallace High School Board of Governors, then Chairman for some years and also a trustee. His experience of, and interest in, education, was utilised as a member of the South Eastern Education and Library Board, of which he became Chairman. His interest in the welfare of young people involved him in the structures of the central Church as Director of the Youth Education Committee, in which capacity he attended the World Council of Christian Education in Jamaica and in Lima, Peru. He served as Convener of the National and International Problems Committee, 1987 to 1993, and was also a member of the Board of Publications and Aids to Worship, and the Historical Society Committee. He was Moderator of the Synod of Antrim and Down in 1989. Mr Gray retired on 31st October 1991 and he and Mrs Gray enjoyed many happy years together until Mrs Gray's death on 17th October 2015. We share with Mr Gray's family in their loss as we give thanks to God for the good and faithful service of our brother.

The **Rev James Stanley McIvor, BA, BD, Ph.D**, Professor Emeritus (Released) the Union Theological College, Belfast, died on 23rd May 2018, in the ninetieth year of his age and the sixty-fourth year of his ministry. He was born on 26th November 1928 at Derryalskea, County Tyrone, an only son and third of four children, to James McIvor, Farmer, Soldier and Civil Servant, and his wife, Florence, née Clayton. The family worshipped then in the congregation of Castlecaulfield where he learned to love the Saviour who first loved him and gave Himself for him. He attended Kilnaslee National School and then the Royal School, Dungannon. A good scholar with a taste for study, he went to the Magee University College, Londonderry, and Trinity College, Dublin, graduating BA in 1949. With a growing sense of call he went on to New College, Edinburgh, from which he graduated BD in 1952. His academic ability won him a scholarship enabling him to study Linguistics at Tübingen University, Germany, also taking the opportunity to learn German which would facilitate his Biblical studies. On his return home, he attended the Assembly's College, Belfast, 1953 to 1954, to complete his qualifying course of study for the Church. Professor McIvor served an assistantship in the large and busy congregation of Great Victoria Street, Belfast, where the Rev James R Boyd was Minister. He became convinced of a call from God to Army Chaplaincy, and was licensed and ordained, or, in Forces terms, commissioned, on 4th June 1954, by the Presbytery of Tyrone in Dungannon congregation to which his family had moved some years previously. It was during this time that he met and married Ruth Patricia Greer on 21st January 1956 and over the next number of years they were blessed with the birth of four children. Army life took them on tours of duty around the world, and,

at one period, Professor McIvor served as Deputy Warden at the Royal Army's Department Depot, Bagshot Park, Surrey, where his work as Assistant Trainer of new Chaplains was greatly valued and respected. He and his family returned to Northern Ireland in 1964 to Londonderry on his appointment as Principal of Magee Theological College, and Professor of Hebrew, New Testament Interpretation and Biblical Literature. During the ensuing years he studied for a Ph.D. which he was awarded in 1977 from the University of Edinburgh. When Magee became part of the University of Ulster in 1978, the Faculty was amalgamated with the Assembly's College and took the name Union College, it is believed at the suggestion of Professor McIvor, and he and R F G Holmes moved to Belfast where they took up professorships in Hebrew and Church History respectively. Professor McIvor acted as Secretary to Union College Faculty for sixteen years writing meticulous minutes of the meetings. His particular academic interest was in Aramaic and he contributed to volume nineteen of The Aramaic Bible, writing on 'The Targum of Chronicles: Translated with Introduction, Apparatus and Notes' (Liturgical Press, 1994). During his thirty years of lecturing several hundreds of theological students came under his influence and owe to him a great debt for his part in equipping them for the ordained ministry. As someone who exercised good self-discipline he expected the same attitude in his students and would brook neither carelessness nor indolence. Yet, he recognised that not every student was a natural Hebraist and he sought to give as much help and encouragement as he could. Even so, it was a daunting experience to sit in his lectures during translation work and suddenly to hear your name called with the command, 'Parse!' Professor McIvor retired on 30th September 1994, and we give thanks for a dedicated servant of God who loved the Scriptures and the Lord of the Scriptures and who demonstrated a life of grace and faith. To his wife, Pat, children, Morag, Colin, Ian, and Louise, their children and the wider family circle, (his sisters pre-deceased him) we extend our prayerful sympathy in their loss.

DEALING WITH THE PAST

On Friday 11th May 2018 the Northern Ireland Office published a consultation paper: 'Addressing the Legacy of Northern Ireland's Past'. The public consultation seeks views on the UK Government's proposal to legislate to establish the institutions set out in a draft Northern Ireland (Stormont House Agreement) Bill. These institutions include:

- The Historical Investigations Unit – to take forward outstanding investigations into Troubles-related deaths.
 - The Independent Commission on Information Retrieval – to enable family members to seek and privately receive information about the Troubles-related deaths of their relatives.
 - The Oral History Archive – an archive that enables people to share experiences and narratives related to the Troubles.
 - The Implementation and Reconciliation Group – an institution to promote reconciliation and anti-sectarianism and to review and assess the implementation of the other legacy institutions proposed under the Stormont House Agreement.
 - The proposals will have a direct impact on many people within our congregations and represent one of the most important developments in recent years in terms of addressing the legacy of the past. It is therefore crucial that the PCI submit a considered response by the closing date on 10th September 2018.
2. It is proposed that a Task Group be set up by the General Assembly to report and make recommendations to a special meeting of the Council for Public Affairs, with the Council for Public Affairs authorised to act on behalf of the Assembly.

EIGHTH AMENDMENT OF THE CONSTITUTION OF IRELAND

3. On Friday, 25th May 2018 citizens in the Republic of Ireland voted by a large margin to repeal the Eighth Amendment of the Constitution of Ireland, which upheld the equal right to life of the mother and the unborn child. The statement released by the Church following the referendum result is included at Appendix A.

4. It is expected that the Government will now introduce legislation allowing unrestricted access to abortion up to 12 weeks of pregnancy and on health grounds after 12 weeks, and that this will pass through the Oireachtas swiftly and easily. Indeed, some members who spoke passionately about retaining the Eighth Amendment have now indicated they will either support the legislation or abstain in light of the referendum result.

5. The PCI must play its part in encouraging longer-term, life-affirming cultural change that enhances support for women in crisis and addresses the societal issues that contribute to abortion. This will involve further conversations with the Government, members of the Oireachtas and others in wider society about how to provide world-leading, compassionate care across Ireland for women, children and families facing pregnancy crisis.

6. As Government officials begin to meet with medical bodies to discuss the implementation of new legislation, it is important that the concerns of medical professionals who cannot, in conscience, participate in abortion provision are taken seriously and properly addressed. This includes those who have a conscientious objection to referring patients seeking an abortion, who should be supported and accommodated within any new system.

APPENDIX A**Statement issued on 26 May 2018 on the outcome of the referendum on the Eighth Amendment of the Constitution****‘Profound sadness’ at referendum result**

The Moderator of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland, Rt. Rev. Dr. Noble McNeely, along with former Moderator and minister emeritus of Lucan Presbyterian Church, Dr. Trevor Morrow, and the Clerk of the denomination’s General Assembly, Rev. Trevor Gribben have expressed their ‘profound sense of sadness’ regarding today’s Eighth Amendment referendum result.

In their statement they said:

We acknowledge the outcome of yesterday’s referendum with a profound sense of sadness. The country is evidently living through a defining moment in which the inherent value placed on human life is at stake. Today is not a day for celebration, but for quiet reflection.

We would strongly urge the Government and the Oireachtas, as they legislate, to keep the promise they have made to the electorate to make abortions ‘rare’ in Ireland, and to ensure that the unborn with disabilities, like Down’s syndrome, will not have their lives terminated.

The result of this referendum hasn’t changed the fact that human life is still just as sacred and special as it was before Friday’s vote. There should be no place for unrestricted abortion in a society that claims to cherish human life.

We would encourage both the Government and wider society to place a greater focus on the provision of world-leading, compassionate care for women, children and families, including comprehensive support in the perinatal period for those facing pregnancy crisis

A further two interviews were conducted by Mrs Sanderson with the Rev Keith Hibbert, a member of the Council and of the Taking Care Committee, and the Moderator, the Rt Rev Dr Charles McMullen, who in his own right is a member of the Council, and of the Disability Services Committee.

Mr Conway and Mrs Judith Gillespie took part in a video-recorded discussion about the recent launch of ‘Taking Care of All’ materials, with specific reference to Domestic Abuse.

The session concluded with a panel discussion involving Mrs Linda Wray (Residential and Supported Services Manager), Ms Joyce McKee (Adult Safeguarding), Mr Hibbert and Mrs Sandford, after which the Moderator expressed thanks and brought the presentation to an end in prayer at 7.52 pm.

SPUD YOUTH ASSEMBLY REPORT

2018 Youth Assembly

1. In February this year the Youth Assembly gathered over one hundred 15-25 year olds from congregations right across the denomination. This year's theme was 'Re-imagine: Presbyterianism for today's generation'.

2. As part of the event, participants were asked, "What gives you reason to celebrate being part of a PCI congregation?" A common response was being part of a multi-generational family of faith in which relationship and connection with other generations was valued. Further conversation found that young people desire the input of older, more experienced, influencers as contributors to their faith journey. This needs to be more than an occasional, token gesture. Building

genuine relationships within church life is a high priority. The shared example of those who are older in the faith has a crucial part to play.

3. These responses inspired the Youth Assembly Working Group to explore how congregations are already connecting the generations together and creating multi-generational environments of faith. These range from the development of informal spaces, in which relationships can be built in social situations, to more intentional programmes of relational discipleship and mentoring.

4. To highlight and promote this crucial area of congregational life, the Youth Assembly Working Group set about creating a video resource to help share with congregations the need and opportunity to develop connection points and relational opportunities across all ages of their church family. This four minute video is now available for use within congregations and will be launched, shown and made available at the Youth Assembly Fringe Event held in the new downstairs conference space in Assembly Buildings on Wednesday 6th June. The event will include stories and discussion around the theme of “Inter-Generational Ministry” and will run from 6.00 – 7.15pm. A light tea will be served. Booking is essential for the event and can be completed online at the PCI website.

5. The Council for Congregational Life and Witness commends this video to congregations and hopes that it will be used throughout the denomination to both inspire and enable the continued development of inter-generational ministry.

A change of name

6. During the past year discussion has taken place within SPUD itself regarding the name ‘SPUD’. A clear consensus has been arrived at for a change of name to ‘The PCI Youth Assembly’. The Council for Congregational Life and Witness is supportive of this name change and an appropriate resolution is appended.

Miss Pip McCracken then interviewed the Rt Rev Peter Gai Lual, Moderator of the Presbyterian Church of South Sudan and Sudan, and Chairperson of the National Council of Churches of South Sudan.

Rev Dr SE Hughes introduced the Rev Manojkumar V. Gohil, a minister of the Church of North India, Gujarat Diocese, Raikhad Congregation in Ahmedabad who spoke about the growing church in Gujarat, after which Dr SE Hughes reflected on her recent visit to India.

Following a video clip, the Rev WS Marrs interviewed Dr Terrence Ascot, Founder and CEO of SAT 7, a Christian Satellite Broadcasting ministry engaged in the Middle East and North Africa.

Subsequent to the first two interviews there was a minute of prayerful reflection. Following the final interview, Rev Dr SE Hughes provided a brief wrap-up and time of open prayer after which the Moderator brought the presentation to an end with Scripture at 2.59pm.

MODERATOR'S ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Item of business overlooked

1. It very recently came to light that a task remitted by the 2017 General Assembly to the Moderator's Advisory Committee had been overlooked. This related to the Memorial of the Rev Dr Ivan Neish in connection with voting membership of a congregation (see 2017 General Assembly Reports page 358) and the resolution of the Assembly on page 56 of the 2017 Minutes, namely:

That the Memorial be received and its prayer be not granted, but that the Moderator's Advisory Committee appoint a Task Group to consider the qualifications of voting members and report to the 2018 Assembly.

2. On discovering this recently, the Clerk of Assembly contacted Dr Neish to apologise and brought the matter to the Moderator's Advisory Committee for discussion. To take the matter forward, the Moderator's Advisory Committee appointed a Task Group, made up of members of the Judicial Commission, Linkage Commission and Finance Panel, as follows:

Moderator, Clerk (Convener), Deputy Clerk, General Assembly Solicitor, Rev Dr Derek McKelvey, Mrs Dianne Lecky, Mr James Livingstone, Mr Kenneth Belshaw, Mrs Elizabeth Moffett and Rev David Johnston.

3. The Task Group has been asked to meet with Dr Neish and hear his concerns and suggestions; to consider all relevant direct and related issues; and to report to the General Council with options and a recommendation. The General Council, having considered the matter, will report to the 2019 General Assembly, including tabling any legislative changes that may be necessary.

Handling of business in the Private Session

4. The Clerk of Assembly reported to the Moderator's Advisory Committee on the contents of a 'challenging conversation' he had recently had with a Minister. The issue of concern relates to someone who has had a matter considered by the Judicial Commission (with full Assembly powers) and decided upon. Even though that decision is final and binding, the Minister has however indicated that he intends to speak to that matter during the Private Session, strongly asserting his intention to address the Assembly on various aspects of

the matter, from his perspective. When advised that it was not in order to speak about any matter that had already been dealt with by the Judicial Commission and that he should not attempt to do so, the Minister stated quite assertively that he intended to do so. The Clerk informed the Minister that he would be referring this stated intention to defy the law of the Church to an appropriate body for consideration before the Assembly.

5. Having considered the particular circumstances, the Moderator's Advisory Committee resolved that the General Assembly Business Committee be requested to licence the following two resolutions for consideration by the 2018 General Assembly, at the end of the initial report of the Business Committee on Tuesday morning:

- 5.(a) That for the 2018 General Assembly, any individual who has had a matter decided by the Judicial Commission on behalf of the Assembly may not address the Assembly on that or any related matter; and that where an individual is asked to give an undertaking to abide by this decision of the Assembly, and refuses to do so, that individual will either not be issued with a Voting Card or have their Voting Card withdrawn.
- 5.(b) That the Judicial Commission considers the matter for subsequent General Assemblies and report, with appropriate overture(s) if necessary, to the 2019 General Assembly.

Visit of Pope Francis

6. Invitations have not yet been issued to other Churches regarding the visit of Pope Francis, as the official programme is only being announced later in June. However, an indication has been given that the Moderator will most likely be invited to be present at a State reception for Pope Francis and would briefly meet with him on that occasion. The Moderator will also most likely be invited to be present as a distinguished guest at the 'Festival of Families' being held on the Saturday evening in Croke Park. When a formal invitation is received the General Council will be called to agree a response (see 2018 Reports, page 72, paragraph 18).

24. That the Council for Public Affairs be encouraged to develop a formal relationship with Evangelical Alliance NI, possibly in a similar manner to the formal relationship that once existed between the former Board of Mission in Ireland and Evangelical Alliance (NI).
25. That the Church Relations Committee be asked to keep the issue of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland's possible membership of World Reformed Fellowship on its agenda.
26. That during the ensuing year the Church Relations Committee consider further the Presbyterian Church in Ireland's continued membership of the Council of European Churches and the Community of Protestant Churches in Europe, having received reports from PCI delegates to both General Assemblies, and report with recommendations to the 2019 General Assembly.
27. That the Presbyterian Church in Ireland [**one option to be selected**]:
- (a) should no longer accept invitations to the Moderator of the General Assembly, or any other formal delegation, to attend the General Assemblies of the Church of Scotland and the United Reformed Church and no longer issue invitations to those two denominations to attend the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland.

7. During the last year discussions have taken place to seek a resolution to what might be described as a small, but significant, anomaly in the current Code. This is to do with the wording of Par 226, relating to the provision whereby a Minister who is unable to remain in his/her charge to the normal retirement date may apply to be designated Minister Emeritus of the congregation(s) they are leaving. This enables the Minister to be a full member of Presbytery and General Assembly. Reference is made to these discussions in paragraph 7 on page 69 of the 2018 Reports.

8. The current provision of Par 226 of the Code relates to Ministers who 'voluntarily resign' from their charge, and the Moderator's Advisory Committee has outlined the process to be followed for such to be considered by the Assembly (see 2018 Reports pages 69 & 73). However the current wording of the Code does not make similar provision for a Minister who, near to retirement, is loosed from his/her charge and where there is no fault (e.g. under Code Par 318(3)(c)). An overture has therefore been drafted, and is included on page 154 of the 2018 Reports, to enable the Assembly to consider amending the Code so that such Ministers may come within the scope of the provision made in Par 226.

9. The Presbytery of North Belfast, having been an advocate for such a change and having been made aware that the 2018 Assembly would be considering that change, has requested that the Rev Jack Drennan would be able to avail of this new provision, if of course the change to Par 226 is agreed by the Assembly. Mr Drennan was loosed from his charge, to facilitate a realignment of ministry, on 1st February 2016, becoming then a Minister without Charge.

10. This request has been considered by the Moderator's Advisory Committee, on the basis of the agreed guidelines, and the Committee is supportive of the request. A suitable resolution is appended, which will be competent only if the 2018 Assembly has earlier amended Par 226 through the overture referred to above.

Par 35 of the Code

After Par 35(g) add a new paragraph as follows:

“(h) act as the employing body concerning all those in remunerated employment in the congregation.” (I.A. 2017, confirmed 2018)

Par 36(f) of the Code

In Par 36(f) delete the words “auxiliary ministers, deaconesses and lay workers” and substitute the words “and auxiliary ministers”. (I.A. 2017, confirmed 2018)

Par 38 of the Code

In Par 38 add the following new sub-paragraph (e):

“(e) notwithstanding the provisions of sub-paragraph (d), not receive a petition of any member or adherent of a congregation who is or has been employed by a congregation under a contract of employment in respect of any grievance relating to such contract of employment where such grievance has been dealt with either under any grievance or disciplinary policy of that congregation relating to its employees, or following any reference of such grievance to a Civil Court or an Industrial Tribunal.” (I.A. 2017, confirmed 2018)

Par 39(1) of the Code

Delete Par 39(1) and substitute the following in its place:

“(1) **Baptism** shall be administered to those who make a profession of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, and to the infant children of one or both believing parents. It shall be administered in all cases by a minister and, as far as possible, it shall be administered publicly. The Kirk Session shall keep a register of all baptisms in the congregation.” (I.A. 2017, confirmed 2018)

Par 39(3) of the Code

“53. Appointment of Trustees and Declarations of Trust. Every congregation shall ensure that:

- (a) congregational trustees are or have been appointed to receive and hold the property of the congregation upon trust for the congregation and subject to its directions so far as those directions comply with the terms of such trust and with this Code save that, but subject to the provisions of paragraph 57(5), congregational property may be transferred to:
- (i) trustees (who shall be not less than three voting members of the congregation) for a separate body set up by, under the jurisdiction of, and accountable to the Kirk Session of the congregation; or
- (ii) to a company limited by guarantee of which the members and directors must at all times be members of the Kirk Session of the congregation and in respect of which the powers of appointing and removing directors shall at all times rest with the members of the Kirk Session of the congregation; and in either case.
- (b) the terms of such trust are set forth in a deed or deeds and, if drawn after the commencement of this Code, are in conformity with the provisions of the relevant rules.” (I.A. 2018)

Par 57(5) of the Code

Delete Par 57(5) and substitute the following in its place:

- “(5) The site and plans of all new buildings proposed to be erected on congregational property and of all proposed demolition, structural alterations or structural additions to existing buildings thereon (including all proposals and designs for memorials, windows, artificial lighting and for seating and furnishings requisite for public worship) shall be authorised, successively, by the congregation, the Presbytery and the Linkage Commission, and without such authorisations no such erection or alteration shall be undertaken or made.” (I.A. 2017, confirmed 2018)

Par 57 of the Code

In Par 57 insert the following new sub-paragraph (5) and renumber existing sub-paragraphs (5)-(7):

- (8) Notice of the convening of a meeting of the congregation for the purpose of giving an approval required under sub-paragraphs (2) or (6) or paragraph 46(f) shall be given from the pulpit on the two Sundays immediately preceding the date of the meeting. (I.A. 2018)

Par 65(2) of the Code

In Par 62(2) delete the words “at the pleasure of the court” and substitute the words “at the pleasure of the court, provided they remain under its jurisdiction”. (I.A. 2017, confirmed 2018)

Par 70(b) of the Code

Delete Par 70(b) and substitute the following in its place:

- “(b) hold consultations with, and visitations of, congregations. (*See Pars 246-247*).” (I.A. 2018)

Par 70(d) of the Code

Delete Par 70(d) and substitute the following in its place:

- “(d) act as charity trustees and be responsible for its compliance with the requirements of charities legislation in Northern Ireland and/ or the Republic of Ireland as appropriate, save that ministers or elders who come within paragraph 61(c) of this Code, for so long as they continue to serve in a role specified in that paragraph, shall not be required to act as charity trustees for the Presbytery but shall nevertheless remain members of the Presbytery.” (I.A. 2018)

Par 75 of the Code

In Par 75 add the following new sub-paragraph (e):

- “(e) notwithstanding the provisions of sub-paragraphs (c) and (d), not receive an appeal from, nor a petition of, any member or adherent of a congregation who is or has been employed by that congregation under a contract of employment in respect of any grievance relating to such contract of employment where such grievance has been dealt with either under any grievance or disciplinary policy of that congregation relating to its employees, or following any reference of such grievance to a Civil Court or an Industrial Tribunal.” (I.A. 2017, confirmed 2018)

Par 76(b) of the Code

Delete Par 76(b) and substitute the following in its place:

- “(b) subject to the provisions of paragraph Par 57(5) and (6) of the Code, examine and approve of the site and plans of all new Church buildings and of all permanent alterations or additions to Church buildings or property and of furnishings used in the conduct of public worship and of any demolition involved in such projects;”. (I.A. 2017, confirmed 2018)

Par 85(1) of the Code

In Par 85(1) delete the words “minister without charge or licentiate” and substitute the words “minister without charge, minister emeritus (released), or licentiate”. (I.A. 2017, confirmed 2018)

Par 85(5)(6) and (7) of the Code

Delete Par 85(5)(6) and (7) and substitute the following in their place:

- “(5) Where difficulty arises as to whether a marriage by the Church is advisable, the minister may consult with his Kirk Session or refer the matter to the Re-marriage Panel of the Pastoral Care Committee under the Council for Congregational Life and Witness before agreeing to celebrate the marriage.
- (6) A minister should not join in marriage a member of the Church with one holding beliefs or having a Church membership incompatible with the Christian witness of the Protestant Reformation, until careful instruction has been given in the doctrines and obligations of our evangelical faith or until other conditions approved by the Re-marriage Panel have been observed.
- (7) While this Church does not prohibit the marriage of a divorced person or persons, it is strongly recommended that a minister does not join in marriage a person who has been divorced, except in circumstances recognised by the Re-marriage Panel as justifying such action. In the case of a divorced minister wishing to remain in office after re-marriage the approval of Presbytery shall be obtained.” (I.A. 2017, confirmed 2018)

Par 146(1)(c) of the Code

In Par 146(c) delete the words “students for the ministry” and substitute the words “students for the ministry, candidates for the office of deaconess” in their place. (2018)

Par 215(6) of the Code

Delete Par 215(6) and renumber subsequent paragraphs. (2018)

Par 224(2)(a) of the Code

In Par 224(a) delete the word “special”. (2018)

Par 226 of the Code

Delete Par 226 and substitute the following in its place:

- “226. (a) When a minister of a congregation or congregations, within five years of his or her normal retirement date, instead of retiring in the usual way either:
- (i) voluntarily resigns the pastoral charge on account of old age, infirmity, sickness or other cause recognised as adequate by the Presbytery, and the resignation has been accepted by Presbytery; or
 - (ii) is loosed under the terms of Par 318(3)(c);
that minister may, if the Presbytery so propose and the Assembly decide, be enrolled as Minister Emeritus of the congregation; and shall in virtue of such enrolment be a member of the superior courts of the Church. As such that minister shall continue under the jurisdiction of Presbytery and shall be subject to the provisions of these rules regarding the acceptance of paid appointments applying to ministers in active duty or ministers without charge.
- (b) in either case there shall be no entitlement to a retiring allowance from Assembly funds, before qualifying normally, nor shall there be any entitlement to an allowance for a temporary period, unless where a special arrangement is made by the Linkage Commission after consultation with the Judicial Commission.” (2018)

Chapter XV, Section IV, Pars 246-251

Delete the Chapter and Section heading and Pars 246-251 and substitute the following in their place:

**“SECTION IV – CONSULTATIONS WITH AND VISITATIONS
OF CONGREGATIONS**

246. (1) Each congregation, Church Extension charge and Church Plant shall engage in an official Consultation with Presbytery at least once in ten years.
- (2) A consultation is a process by which Presbytery enquires into the life of a congregation in order to discover:
- encouragements to celebrate, for the edification of the congregation and to inspire the rest of Presbytery;
 - challenges faced by the congregation, so that Kirk Session can be directed and equipped to deal with the most pressing issues;
 - any concerns that Kirk Session may be struggling to deal with, requiring the intervention of Presbytery.
- (3) Normally there should not be a consultation with a congregation until at least two years after the installation or induction of the lead minister.
- (4) Resources and Guidance for consultations shall be authorised from time to time by the General Council.
247. (1) A visitation of a congregation, Church Extension charge or Church Plant may also be held when the Presbytery considers it to be necessary.
- (2) The purpose of a visitation of a congregation by Presbytery is to enquire into particular matters affecting the congregation.
- (3) A visitation should normally be carried out by a commission of Presbytery, the membership to be chosen taking account of the nature of the circumstances. If necessary to achieve appropriate representation, communicant members from congregations within the bounds of the Presbytery may be added on a ‘sit and deliberate’ basis.
- (4) The essential stages in visitation are: Notification, Inquiry, Finding and Report. The form the visitation takes will be determined by Presbytery according to the specific circumstances. Authorised consultation resources may be used after appropriate adaptation.
- (5) Congregations shall be given formal notice by Presbytery of the intended visitation and the proposed procedures being followed. This shall be read to the congregation on a convenient Sunday, with an invitation to members to forward anything which they wish to bring to the Presbytery’s attention concerning the matters being inquired into.

- (6) With the Presbytery's notice there shall be sent any appropriate documentation for completion by relevant parties and any request for documentation the Presbytery wishes to examine.
- (7) As part of the inquiry, meetings may be held separately and privately with relevant parties. A public meeting or meetings open to all members of the congregation (including adherents) should also normally be held. Such meetings may include any of these elements: reports, questions, discussion. The Presbytery may also address the congregation on specific matters.
- (8) Subsequent to the visitation the Presbytery shall reach an official finding. The finding shall first be read in private to any parties that the Presbytery deems appropriate. Unless there is an appeal, the finding as adopted shall be published by being read to the congregation on a convenient Sunday by a ministerial member of Presbytery, who shall also address the congregation as appropriate to the circumstances. If the visitation has been conducted by a commission, the reading of the finding should not be delayed to allow for reporting to Presbytery.
- (9) A minute of the procedure followed and the finding adopted shall be inserted in the Presbytery minute book; and a copy of the finding shall be furnished to the Kirk Session for retention in its minute book.
- (10) Within twelve months after the visitation of a congregation, the Presbytery shall require the minister or representative elder to report on how far the instructions and/or recommendations of Presbytery have been carried out.
- (11) In case of neglect to give effect to its instructions and/or recommendations, or at the desire of the minister or representative elder, the Presbytery shall again send a member to address the congregation; or it shall take such other action as it sees fit.

248-251. (*deleted*)" (2018)

Par 256(2) of the Code

In Par 256(2) delete the words "visitation of" and substitute the words "consultation with" in their place. (2018)

Par 258(c) of the Code

Delete Par 258(c) and substitute the following in its place:

- "(c) The Statistical Sheets when so completed shall:
- (i) be presented to the Presbyteries at their stated meetings in April or May each year, to be examined and certified by them; and
 - (ii) when so certified, be forwarded by the Clerks of Presbyteries to the Financial Secretary, Assembly Buildings, not later than 10th May." (2018)

Par 260(g) of the Code

In Par 260(g) delete the word “visited” and substitute the words “consulted or visited” in its place. (2018)

Par 273(2) of the Code

In Par 273(2) delete the words “the visitation of” and substitute the words “a consultation with or visitation of” in their place. (2018)

Par 273(5)(d)(iii) of the Code

In Par 273(5)(d)(iii) delete the words “sub-paragraph (5)(c)(ii)” and substitute the words “sub-paragraph (5)(d)(ii)” in their place. (2018)

Par 273(5)(d)(v) of the Code

In Par 273(5)(d)(v) delete the words “twelve months” and substitute the words “twelve months from the date when notice of termination is given” in their place. (2018)

Par 306(1) of the Code

In Par 306(1) delete the word “visitations” and substitute the word “consultations” in its place. (2018)

Par 308 of the Code

Delete Par 308 and substitute the following in its place:

308. (1) **Name:** The name of the organisation shall be *Presbyterian Women*, incorporating the former *Presbyterian Women’s Association* and the former *Young Women’s Groups*, and may also be referred to as PW.
- (2) **Motto:** The motto of *Presbyterian Women* shall be: Living for Jesus
- (3) **Mission Statement and Aims:**
Presbyterian Women encourages women to become disciples of Christ.
Presbyterian Women aims to highlight the need for –
 - (i) Love and unity
 - (ii) Obedience to God
 - (iii) Christian living and spiritual maturity
 - (iv) Service using gifts, time and money
 - (v) Local and global mission

(4) **PW Groups:**

Where possible a group shall be formed in each congregation to bring together women at a congregational level, encourage them to become disciples of Jesus Christ and work to fulfil the aims of *Presbyterian Women*. Each group shall operate under the authority of the Kirk Session. Stated meetings shall be held and membership shall be open to all women who accept the aims of *Presbyterian Women*.

(5) **PW LINK** (Living, Inspiring and Nurturing for the Kingdom):

There shall be in each Presbytery a PW Committee known as the PW LINK to bring together members of Presbyterian Women.

Constituent members:

Three members from each PW Group, at least one of whom should be an Office Bearer. Each member to serve for three years, unless:

- (i) elected to serve on the PW Forum or the PW LINK Planning Committee Subgroup, or
- (ii) appointed to represent Presbyterian Women at the General Assembly or Presbytery.

In these circumstances membership of the PW LINK should be extended until the additional responsibilities end.

(6) **PW Forum:**

There shall be a PW Forum to bring together PW LINK representatives at a central level.

The PW Forum shall be made up of:

- (a) members of the PW Panel and its Subgroups;
- (b) five representatives from each PW LINK:
 - (i) the three serving PW LINK Office Bearers i.e. Chairperson, Secretary and Treasurer; and
 - (ii) two others from each PW LINK, appointed to attend for 3 years."

Others may also be invited to attend, as appropriate.

(7) **PW Panel:**

The decision-making body of the Organisation shall be a PW Panel under the Women's Strategy and Coordination Committee (WSCC).

Constituent members:

- (a) Council Convener, Council Secretary, Convener of WSCC, PW President, PW Home Vice President, PW Overseas Vice President;
- (b) Two members drawn from the membership of the WSCC;
- (c) Seven members drawn from a PW Volunteer Bank into which members' names were submitted.

The Women's Ministry and PW Development Officer, the PW Support Officer and the Moderator's wife shall be invited to sit and deliberate.

Voting members will serve a maximum of four years and can serve two consecutive terms.

- (8) **Finance:** The financial year of PW shall end on 31st December. A statement of income and expenditure shall be submitted to the Annual Meeting of *Presbyterian Women*. A report and statement of annual accounts shall be submitted to the PW Panel, the Council for Congregational Life and Witness, the General Assembly and, if appropriate, other relevant Councils. Each PW Group will receive a copy of an Annual Report including a Financial Supplement. (2018)

Par 318(3)(d) of the Code

Delete Par 318(3)(d) and substitute the following in its place:

- “(3) (d) to make appropriate arrangements for the minister. In so acting, the Linkage Commission shall have power to make a special arrangement in accordance with the terms of Par 226(b).” (2018)

Appendix 6 of the Code

Delete Appendix 6, sub-paragraph C and substitute the following in its place:

“C: For a Meeting to Appoint new Trustees

Notice is hereby given that a meeting of the congregation of will be held (as may be decided) on Sunday, the of, in the Church immediately after the close of public worship, OR on, the of, at the hour of in when an appointment of new trustees will be made by the members of the congregation duly qualified to vote at the election of the Minister; and that no person but a member of the congregation is eligible for such appointment to office, save that the Education Board of the Presbytery may be so appointed.” (2018)
