In CCF, we have begun a series looking at The Apostles' Creed. The word 'creed' comes from the Latin word 'credo' meaning, 'I believe and trust'. As we all interact with people, wherever we are, Cluj-Napoca or Belfast, we need to know what we believe in order to live out what Peter wrote in 1 Peter, '...Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have...' This can be daunting but we need to remember we believe, and serve, God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

As a fellowship we enjoy gathering for worship but also socially. Recently we met for a potluck supper. We took the opportunity to discuss together the content and format of our worship service. Those who attend the CCF services come from a range of denominations and traditions. Where possible we seek to ensure that our services are accessible for everyone and that there will be something familiar in them for our membership to feel comfortable and at home while they worship Jesus.

In October there will be a meeting to assess the work the church has been involved in due to the ongoing conflict in Ukraine. We are looking forward to what may materialise from this meeting. The church has made good contacts and we hope there will be a way to consolidate this work in a meaningful way for the Ukrainian families and for the congregation of Tóköz.

This month we will meet up with the international students as Universities will commence. We have kept in touch with a number of them who remained in the city throughout the summer.
