Location: Blantyre, MALAWI Mission: Theological education



Volker's Deputation September and TEE research

Volker returned to Malawi at the very end of September after spending a few weeks in Belfast on deputation. He carried something special in his hand luggage back home – nine kilograms of printed paper. Let me explain.

One unusual effect of Covid was that the delivery of post and book shipments into Malawi from small booksellers dried up. Every visit to Europe is an opportunity to search publications related to TEE (theological education by extension) because we can transport them back to Malawi. One of the projects that Volker is working on is a history of how TEE started. TEE originated in the Presbyterian Church in Guatemala in 1963. It was an experiment to try something new in response to changing circumstances. The method was copied by many. Understanding its origin and development is vital to learning how TEE can continue to respond to changes.



OCTOBER 2022

For many years, Volker has been hunting for early TEE material, newsletters, publications, etc. Something happened over the summer that Volker never thought possible. While talking to someone who was a TEE practitioner in the 1970s in the Philippines, the individual mentioned that he had a collection of early publications and was planning to throw them away but wondered if Volker was interested. To cut a long story of God's provision short, he sent Volker 9 kilogrammes of newsletters, small publications, and even publications out of Guatemala. The fantastic thing is that many TEE practitioners had material in the 1970s but then moved houses and countries, and the material is lost. He had kept it, even though his ministry moved him in a different direction.

Additionally, he and Volker talked, and the topic arose about the old material. The material is a wonderful treasure trove and will add tremendous depth to Volker's research. God is good!
