'Intersex'

Disorders of sexual development (DSDs) (formerly hermaphroditism or pseudohermaphroditism)

Conditions in which sexual characteristics do not align in the normal male or female pattern: chromosomes, gonads, internal sex organs, external genitalia, secondary sexual characteristics

Usually manifest either at birth or puberty



If you were born female, but are not happy with being a girl, or born male and feel that you are unhappy being a boy; this is known as gender dysphoria.



"gender nonconformity is not in itself a mental disorder. The critical element of gender dysphoria is the presence of clinically significant distress associated with the condition."



Home > Births, deaths, marriages and care > Certificates, register offices, changes of name or gender

Apply for a Gender Recognition Certificate

Certificates, register offices, changes of name or gender

- you're 18 or over
- you've been diagnosed with gender dysphoria (discomfort with your birth gender) - this is also called gender identity disorder or transsexualism
- you've lived in your acquired gender for at least 2 years
- you intend to live in your acquired gender for the rest of your life

The consultation on the Gender Recognition Act, to be published in the Autumn, will look to improve the recognition process and reduce the stigma faced by the trans community. Proposals will include:

- Removing the need for a medical diagnosis of gender dysphoria before being able to apply for gender recognition. The current need to be assessed and diagnosed by clinicians is seen as an intrusive requirement by the trans community; and
- Proposing options for reducing the length and intrusiveness of the gender recognition system.

It will aim to relieve the bureaucratic and medical burdens for those who choose to change their gender.

Unlike biological sex, gender is indeed a social construct: accordingly, an individual's identity is an essential part of their autonomy. Why should a trans 16-year-old require a doctor's permission to declare herself a woman? And why should NHS resources be wasted on such humiliation?

Transgender Statistics (UK)

- 20 per 100,000 (1000 people) ¹
- 6000 have transitioned (80% male to female)
- 1% may have some degree of gender variation ²
- 61% to 88% of gender dysphoric children do not persist into adulthood (although many identify as homosexual)

Terminology

homosexual bisexual

1892 Used by neurologist Charles Gilbert Chaddock in translating Richard von Krafft-Ebing's *Psychopathia Sexualis* from German

transsexual

1949 Coined by sexologist David Oliver Cauldwell to denote people whose "psychological sex" was different from their "biological sex"

gender

1955 An older word (early 15th Century) for human sex redefined by John Money to mean socially assigned roles distinct from sex

transgender

1965 Coined by psychiatrist John F. Oliven in Sexual hygiene and pathology as a synonym for transsexual; redefined in 1970s by activist Virginia Prince for identifying as other gender without surgery

Not evidence based

- Higher rates of mental health problems are due exclusively or predominantly to social pressures
- Homosexual and transgender people are "born this way"

"Yet despite the scientific uncertainty, drastic interventions are prescribed and delivered to patients identifying, or identified, as transgender. This is especially troubling when the patients receiving these interventions are children."

You shall not lie with a male as with a woman; it is an abomination. (Leviticus 18:22)

A woman shall not wear a man's garment, nor shall a man put on a woman's cloak, for whoever does these things is an abomination to the LORD your God. (Deuteronomy 22:5)

New Testament

- Romans 1:26-27
- 1 Corinthians 6:9; 1 Timothy 1:10

Romans 1:26-27

For this reason God gave them up to dishonourable passions. For their women exchanged natural relations for those that are contrary to nature; and the men likewise gave up natural relations with women and were consumed with passion for one another, men committing shameless acts with men and receiving in themselves the due penalty for their error.

(Romans 1:26-27)

- Unnatural = not in line with God's intention in creation
- Root problem = rejection of God and idolatry (v18-25)

malakoi & arsenokoitai

1 Corinthians 6:9

- "men who have sex with men" (NIV)
- "men who practise homosexuality" (ESV)
- "male prostitutes ... practice homosexuality" (NLT)
- "effeminate ... abusers of themselves with mankind" (KJV)

Malakoi

Softness – possibly moral laxness?

Arsenokoitai (also 1Timothy 1:10)

- lying with (koitai) a man (arseno)
- Coined to echo Leviticus 18:22 and 20:13
- Passive and active partners in male homosexual activity?
- Men who act like women and those who have sex with men?



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

A better story?

The sexual revolution is not held in the popular imagination as a list of facts - **it is held as a story** [...] about the freeing of the human spirit from the stifling shame of Christian tradition. [...]

In response we have often deployed complicated arguments, or listed the 'deviances' and the diseases. This simply doesn't work. We have to tell a different story. A better story that appeals to imagination as well as intellect.




Two suggestions:

- The best story is the true story (even if the truth is inconvenient)
- The ultimate goal is not human flourishing, but God's glory (the gospel is theocentric, not anthropocentric)

A Christian framework?

- a) Insist on "integrity" Focus = original creation
- b) Support for "disability" Focus = Fall
- c) Celebrate "diversity" Focus = glorification
- d) Integrated framework Focus = redemption



A gospel perspective

- God rules created male and female to reflect God's image to creation (Genesis 1 v27); marriage is an enactment of God's covenant love (Genesis 2 v20-25)
- We rebelled sin causing delusion, confusion and rebellion, including bringing abuse and distrust between the sexes (Genesis 3 v16)
- God redeems forgiveness for past sins and hope through Jesus Christ
- We respond we need to repent, believe and obey, living positively as male and female, single or married
- God restores we can know the Spirit's help in the present individually and corporately in the Church and we have living hope for the future (suffering and struggles in perspective)

Honour everyone

 E.g., reversal of surgery may not be possible; adopted children need care; use of pronouns / names

Listen and seek understanding

 Do not condemn or pre-judge; distinguish feelings from actions; do not affirm behaviours and identity

Seek to align with biological sex

– Health = wholeness

Promote the biblical vision

True principles within the true story

Pastoral responses

- Dysphoria (or inner struggle) help and healing for pain through presence and prayer
- Attraction resisting temptation; denying desires; seeking transformation
- Actions repenting for sin; choosing faithfulness; persevering in loving community
- Identity refusing non-biblical labels; correcting unbiblical ideas (e.g., feelings = identity; experience attraction c.f. be 'gay')


Jesus was never reluctant to challenge received wisdoms that He wanted to change. He gives no impression that He came into the world to revolutionise sexual mores.


Revelation, therefore, not logic, must lie at the core of the Church's message. You cannot pick and choose from revealed truth.





