That makes this team up to four members, and Peter is very much looking forward to supporting Rajendra as he returns to work here. There will be over nine new teachers arriving in Nepal looking for accommodation and being introduced to their new school and pupils. Some are very new to teaching while others are old hands, but no matter, changing school and country is never simple. Nicola and Stephen Stewart who are members of Bushvale Presbyterian Church are returning to Nepal having previously served with INF in Pokhara. Pray for them as they settle into life in Kathmandu and for Nicola as she takes on a role in student support. Jayne is really looking forward to working with her during the first term. One major challenge is that term will begin without a primary principal in place.
