Mission: Integral development and teaching




These final weeks and months in Nepal have turned out to be very fruitful. We are so pleased to have been able to remain here long enough to complete some tasks which others will be able to carry forward in the coming months and years.

Recently Peter has been involved in many discussions about how Integral Mission work can be continued. He is hopeful that another expat might replace him and that there might also be one further Nepali to join this work. The 'Facilitation guide' that has been worked on for many months by six writers has now been published. It runs to 120 pages of resources and help for college staff. It was a huge privilege to join almost 30 teachers from 15 colleges and training institutions for a three day introduction for this course. Our prayer is that this will be the first of many such events to develop the capacity of those who are teaching leaders the importance of gospel love and good deeds. Preparing to leave Nepal is difficult and Peter has also spent much time contemplating potential opportunities for future involvement and links. We are very much praying that even from a distance there will be ongoing engagement.

OCTOBER 2022

There is never a dull minute at KISC, even the constant monsoon rain does not dampen enthusiasm. The one thing you need to be at KISC is flexible, and as teachers and assistants have been sick everyone pitches in and does what is needed to allow the school to run smoothly. Jayne has recently been teaching in P1 and had a lovely day with P6. Primary has just finished a day of student led conferences and as term one draws to a close Primary and lower Secondary are practising hard at the musical, "Danny and the Shacks." The story of the book of Daniel will be performed on the 23rd and 24th September. KISC has been credited as a British School Overseas (BSO) school which now will allow newly qualified teachers to get their professional qualifications. Interviews are underway for the new director of KISC Equip and interviews for a Primary principal will take place soon. It is with a heavy heart that Jayne says goodbye to colleagues and friends after having had a life changing experience living and working in Kathmandu.

We are very aware of all kinds of needs both now and longer term. The monsoon has recently intensified with 21 deaths and others missing through landslides, plus thousands of homes inundated. Just as Covid seems to be declining, the country is being hit with mosquito borne Dengue fever. There have recently been 16,500 infections and 20 deaths, most of them in Kathmandu. The annual holiday season is soon to begin and there are real fears of a huge upsurge.

We leave Nepal deeply thankful for countless things, and we ask you to continue to pray with us for this amazing land and for all that is happening in it.
