The theme of this year's Appeal is **Reclaiming Hope.** The Appeal highlights the enduring and particular challenges of sustainable development in post-conflict situations, and, at the same time, the ways in which the effects of climate change continue to make themselves felt in almost every aspect of sustainable community development, and in almost every context.

The projects being highlighted this year are in **El Salvador** and **Brazil.** El Salvador is still recovering, almost 25 years later, from the long-term after effects of a 12 year civil war which came to a formal end in 1992. Our partner in El Salvador is **PROCARES** (**Programme for Capacity-Building and Reconstruction in El Salvador**), who are working with resettled refugees in the Jiquilisco Bay region. The 2016 Appeal will also support **ACEV** (**Evangelical Action**) in Brazil, who are working with some of the country's most isolated populations in the semi-arid northeast.

Thank you for your committed and sustained work on behalf of the World Development Appeal, and many grateful thanks to the Presbyteries and congregations you serve for their continuing generosity. May our own lives, as well as the lives of our partners, be shaped for the good by our giving.
