Gary and Mary Reid and their family have been working with the Maasai people in southwest Kenya since 2005. Partnering with

the Presbyterian Church of East Africa (PCEA), they are involved in church planting and development work with the PCEA Acacia Grove Mission Station.

Acacia Grove helps vulnerable children who have suffered from abuse, female genital mutilation (FGM), child labour or neglect. It also assists women who have been abused, and provides refuge when this is required.

The mission station has a holistic approach to offering care in the community. As well as helping with education and distributing Bibles, they deliver food, when it is needed, to malnourished children and poor families.

They also transport seriously ill or injured people to one of the local dispensaries, or larger hospitals – the closest being over 75kms away. With the help of United Appeal, God continues to work through the Reids to build His Kingdom among the Maasai in this area.

The International Meeting Point (IMP), located on Belfast's Lisburn Road, reaches out to migrants and asylum seekers in the city.

Funded by United Appeal and the South Belfast Presbytery, the centre welcomes people from over 30 different countries and is dedicated to meeting their practical and spiritual needs.

The IMP offers a wide variety of help and services to those who come through its doors: serving food and drinks in the café, offering legal advice, running English classes,
