## The 100 Game

- Prepare your pens and paper.
- Print out page two and cut the rules below into strips.
- Announce to the group that the aim is: "to write the numbers one to one hundred" on their paper. Explain that the first to achieve the aim will win a small prize, as long as you keep to the rules.
- Give each person a pen and piece of paper. Ensure that from this point, NO ONE is to speak.
- Give each person a piece of paper with the rules on it and ask them to read them carefully. The twist is that each person's "rules" are slightly different.
- Shout "GO!" and watch the mayhem ensue...
- This game is good fun, but can be used to reflect on the purpose of rules, what happens when people have their own rules, how it felt when you saw others doing something different to you and so on.

Items needed:

- A pen or pencil and a piece of paper for each person.
- Copies of the second sheet below, cut into strips, so that there is one strip for each person.
